O que são odds e por que são importantes?

As odds, ou "cotas", representam a relação entre a quantidade que se ganha com uma aposta vencedora e o valor da aposta inicial. Este é um conceito fundamental nos resultados das apostas esportivas. Na maioria dos casos, se você ver as odds como um número simples que representa o lucro da aposta vencedora por cada unidade de aposta.

Como calcular as suas ganhos com as odds?

Para calcular as suas ganhos com as odds, basta usar a fórmula: $\text{lucro} = \text{aposta} \times (\text{odds} - 1)$. Por exemplo, se você

apostar 100 e a odd for 1.25, o lucro seria o seguinte: $100 \times (1.25 - 1) = 25$

ou seja, 100, mais o lucro, 25. Dessa forma, o retorno total

seria de 125.
